
A Thank You from a

CUSP, Cambodian University Scholarship Project, is now seven years old. It was created out of a burning desire to help our Cambodian Khmer villagers change the cycle of poverty through education.

God has blessed our efforts, and those of our Cambodian Board partners. We are now housing and supporting 34 students in the dorms in Kompong Thom, and there are eight high school graduates now attending institutions of higher education! Many others have already graduated from universities with CUSP scholarship help and are now working and taking leadership to mentor current students.

English proficiency is a high priority, so one ongoing goal and challenge is to provide our high school and university students with excellent English training. To that end, the third annual English Intensive Camp will take place mid-

August at the high school dorms with teachers from the CUSP U.S. Board as part of the team. There is much to celebrate! And much work left to be done!

Khmer Book Club


The Elimination

The Khmer Book Club met to discuss the first half of *The Elimination* by Rithy Panh. Even though several reading the book couldn't join us, we had a very interesting discussion at our first meeting on May 16, so we decided to meet again. We will continue delving into Panh's courageous interviews with Duch, the commandant of the Killing Fields during Cambodian leader Pol Pot's four-year regime.

Pol Pot's agenda was to eliminate

all class differentiation and Cambodian culture. He emptied the cities, returning <u>all</u> the people to agrarian lifestyles, and killing 1.5 million people by torture and starvation before he was stopped.



The book tells Panh's story of surviving the devastation and death around him. Panh then relives those years as he tries to understand the motive and reasoning behind the immense atrocities perpetrated by Cambodians against their own people.



Session Uses Congregational Survey Results to Define Clearer Vision for Calvin Church

A year ago, June 2013, the leaders of Calvin asked you to participate in a church-wide survey called the **Transforming Church Index (TCI)**. At the time, we sought insights to include in our Denominational Discernment Process. What you shared, however, has broader implications.

The TCI revealed that many didn't feel Calvin had a clearly defined vision for the future--that there was a *lack of clarity* around what makes Calvin different from other churches, who we're trying to reach and serve, and our goals and overall direction. Since then, our session and staff have spent much time talking, dreaming, and most importantly praying about what's next for our congregation. While we're still working to put words to what the Lord is revealing, I want to share what God is putting on my heart, and ask you to pray for our church's leaders as we prepare for what God has in store for us.

Forming Community

People in our neighborhoods, like people everywhere, have a **need to belong**. We all want meaningful relationships; we want to feel like we're part of something. God's desire is to form a community of people united to Jesus Christ and adopted into his body, the Church. The TCI showed many at Calvin feel a lack of warmth, caring, and fellowship; so we will work to foster deeper and healthier connections within the church.

But God is also calling Calvin to extend a redemptive hospitality to those *beyond Calvin*, especially those our society overlooks or pushes to the margins. Ministries connecting us with our community—such as Bridge Disability Ministries and Vision House—will continue to help us do this.

The TCI also revealed many at Calvin highly value our building. We want to extend hospitality by using our facility as a community center to host groups including AA meetings, private parties, Mothers of Preschoolers (MOPS),

homeowners associations, Seattle Children's Chorus rehearsals and more. To all, we give the invitation: "Make a connection!"

Transforming Lives

People everywhere are also looking to **change their lives for the better.** We want to grow. We want healthier relationships with our families and friends. We want to be closer to God. And Jesus is the one who meets these needs and can empower these changes.

Acknowledging that the TCI showed many in our congregation lack a sense of personal growth that goes beyond mere knowledge, God continues to call Calvin Church to embrace spiritual formation, the grace-driven process in which the soul grows in conformity to the image of Christ. We will emphasize reconciliation and healing in relationships with **Stephen Ministry** and the **Marriage Course**. We will teach about God's good plans for us, and specifically support parents of youth and children. We will say to all, "Make a change!"

Reforming Our World

People also want lives full of meaning and purpose. They want to address the needs they see in their community, and they want to **make the world a better place**. And Christ's body—his people, not the institutional church—is the primary strategy through which God works to advance His Kingdom.

Our TCI scores indicate that our church has a good reputation, is making a contribution to the community, and is interested in making a difference in people's lives. So, whether it's across the street or across the globe, Calvin Church will engage the world in holistic ways, balancing acts of compassion, works for justice, and the proclamation of the Gospel. We will follow God's call onto community college campuses and to the Khmer people of Cambodia. We will challenge each other to see ourselves as God's agents sent into our neighborhoods, offices, and schools. We will say to all, "Make a difference!"

There you have it: Community Formed; Lives Transformed; the World Reformed—in a way that is centered on Christ and shaped by the Gospel.

Call for Prayer - and Change

Pursuing this emerging vision, however, requires us all to do our part, and necessitates some changes to what we're already doing. A task force of Calvin members, approved by the session, met last winter to **evaluate the ministry and leadership structure of our church** which has remained largely unchanged for many years.

This spring the session reviewed the task force's recommended changes designed to help us become the church we want to be. We are having honest and often difficult conversations about the shape of our staff going forward, and how the staff, session, ministry leaders, and church members can best work together. Although we need to be responsible and good stewards, this is not just about budget numbers. It is about aligning ourselves to pursue God's best for Calvin in the days ahead.

While you will hear more about this in the coming days, I want to ask you now to **pray earnestly** for your church's leaders. Ask the God of grace and glory to fulfill the words of the old hymn:

"Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, for the facing of this hour."

And if you have questions, ideas, or words of encouragement, by all means share those with any member of the session.


